**Q1** What are the chances that you will vote in next week's election for Governor and the U.S. Senate? Have you already voted, will you definitely vote, will you probably vote, are the chances 50/50, or will you probably not vote?

**Q2** The candidates for U.S. Senate are independent Greg Orman, Republican Pat Roberts, and Libertarian Randall Batson. If the election was today, who would you vote for?

**Q3** The candidates for Governor are Democrat Paul Davis, Republican Sam Brownback, and Libertarian Keen Umbehr. If the election was today, who would you vote for?

**Q4** Do you support or oppose raising the minimum wage from \$7.25 per hour to \$10.10 per hour?

**Q5** Do you think you could support your household on a federal minimum-wage salary, which comes out to \$1,250 per month, or about \$15,000 per year?

**Q6** Which do you think is the better way to create an economy that works for everyone: cutting taxes and regulations on big businesses and the wealthy or paying fair wages and investing in American workers?

**Q7** Pat Roberts voted against the Paycheck Fairness Act, which would help ensure equal pay for equal work. Does this make you more likely or less likely to vote for him, or does it not make a difference?

**Q8** In 2013, Senator Pat Roberts voted against a bill that would require most gun sales be subject to a background check. Does Senator Roberts' opposition to comprehensive gun background checks make you more likely or less likely to vote for him, or does it not make a difference?

**Q9** Greg Orman believes women are the best at making decisions about their reproductive health, while Pat Roberts opposes abortion. Does this make you more likely to vote for Greg Orman or Pat Roberts?

*Greg Orman* ..... 45%  
*Pat Roberts* ..... 42%  
*Not sure* ..... 13%

**Q10** In the last presidential election, did you vote for Barack Obama or Mitt Romney?

*Barack Obama* ..... 38%  
*Mitt Romney* ..... 55%  
*Someone else / Don't remember* ..... 7%

**Q11** If you are a woman, press 1. If a man, press 2.

*Woman* ..... 53%  
*Man* ..... 47%

**Q12** If you are a Democrat, press 1. If a Republican, press 2. If you're an independent or identify with another party, press 3.

*Democrat* ..... 31%  
*Republican* ..... 53%  
*Independent / Other* ..... 16%

**Q13** If white, press 1. If African-American, press 2. If other, press 3.

*White* ..... 90%  
*African-American* ..... 6%  
*Other* ..... 4%

**Q14** If you are 18 to 29 years old, press 1. If 30 to 45, press 2. If 46 to 65, press 3. If you are older than 65, press 4.

*18 to 29* ..... 9%  
*30 to 45* ..... 19%  
*46 to 65* ..... 42%  
*Older than 65* ..... 30%
