Q1 What are the chances that you will vote in next week's election for the U.S. Senate and Governor? Have you already voted, will you definitely vote, will you probably vote, are the chances 50/50, or will you probably not vote?

<i>Have already voted</i>	38%
<i>Will definitely vote</i>	59%
<i>Will probably vote</i>	4%
<i>Chances are 50/50</i>	0%
<i>Will probably not vote</i>	0%

Q2 The candidates for Senate are Democrat Kay Hagan, Republican Thom Tillis, and Libertarian Sean Haugh. If the election was today, who would you vote for?

<i>Kay Hagan</i>	46%
<i>Thom Tillis</i>	45%
<i>Sean Haugh</i>	4%
<i>Undecided</i>	5%

Q3 As Speaker of the North Carolina House, Thom Tillis short-changed education funding by \$500 million. Does Thom Tillis' record on education make you more likely or less likely to vote for him, or does it not make a difference?

Q5 Thom Tillis opposes a measure to ensure equal pay for women at work. Does this make you more likely or less likely to vote for Thom Tillis, or does it not make a difference?

Q6 In 2013, Senator Kay Hagan voted for a bill that would require most gun sales be subject to a background check. Does Kay Hagan's support for gun background checks make you more likely or less likely to vote for her, or does it not make a difference?

Q7 40 million Americans now owe over \$1.2 trillion in student loan debt. Senator Hagan supports allowing student loan borrowers to refinance their loans to lower rates, saving families thousands of dollars in interest payments. How important is this issue to you?
